## 1. Question:

In what language are the studies conducted?

### Answer:

Lectures are given in English.

## 2. Question:

What is the tuition fee?

### Answer:

Study fee per year: 5540 EUR (for citizens of Latvia)

Study fee per year: 6920 EUR (for citizens of EU, EEA, CIS countries, Georgia, Ukraine and other countries)

An additional 15% discount is given to graduates of the RISEBA University Bachelor's study program ARCHITECTURE for the first year of study.

## 3. Question:

What times do studies in the MA program in architecture take place?

### Answer:

The lecture times are: Thursday, Fridays from 18.00-21.30 and on Saturdays 10.00-15.00

## 4. Question:

Is it possible to combine studies with work while studying the Master's program of architecture at RISEBA University?

### Answer:

Yes that is possible. Lectures are held Thursday, Friday evenings and on Saturdays.

## 5. Question:

Do I have a tuition fee discount for master's studies in architecture at RISEBA University if I have obtained a bachelor's degree in architecture at the same university?

### Answer:

Yes, students who have obtained a Bachelor's degree in architecture at RISEBA University have a 15% discount on the tuition fee for the first year of study
